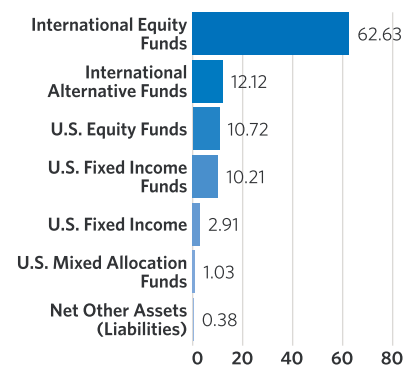

## INVESTMENT STRATEGY

The portfolio's sub-adviser, J.P. Morgan Investment Management Inc. (the "sub-adviser"), seeks to achieve the portfolio's investment objective by investing its assets in a broad mix of underlying Transamerica funds ("underlying portfolios"). The portfolio expects to allocate its investments in underlying portfolios with the goal of achieving exposure targets over time of approximately 70% of its net assets in equity securities and approximately 30% of its net assets in fixed income securities with approximately 10% of its net assets in equity and fixed-income securities of issuers in emerging markets. The actual percentage allocations at any time may vary. The portfolio will generally have exposure to issuers located in at least three different countries outside the U.S. The sub-adviser may increase its international developed markets equity exposure to approximately 90% of the portfolio's net assets or decrease its international developed markets equity exposure to approximately 30% of net assets, and may increase fixed income exposure to approximately 70% of net assets or may decrease fixed income exposure to approximately 10% of net assets, subject to the portfolio's multi-factor risk management framework. The risk management framework incorporates quantitative models and signals. Under this framework, the portfolio's maximum equity exposure may be limited in response to individual asset class momentum signals and a portfolio level volatility signal. Notwithstanding the portfolio's equity target and any maximum equity exposure limit imposed under the risk management framework, the sub-adviser may elect to allocate fewer assets to equities and more assets to fixed income when it believes it is advisable to do so. The portfolio may not achieve its stated asset mix goal.

The underlying portfolio uses a volatility control strategy. **Volatility control strategies, in periods of high market volatility, could limit your participation in market gains; this may conflict with your investment objectives by limiting your ability to maximize potential growth of your policy value.** Volatility control strategies are intended to help limit overall volatility and reduce the effects of significant market downturns during periods of high market volatility, providing policy owners with the opportunity for smoother performance and better risk adjusted returns.
